

Designing Your New Home

Designing and building a custom home is one of life's great accomplishments and something that most people only do once in their lifetime, if at all. Because of this, most people have a lot of questions and are unsure of where to start. We'll take a look at the five most important things to consider when starting your design journey.

1. Location

What is the most important factor when buying or selling a home? According to most real estate professionals it's location, location, location!!!

Perhaps you're happy with your current home but just not loving the neighborhood. The problem with that is, you can't renovate or build an addition that will make up for a less than ideal location. Even tearing down your home and starting over can't fix a bad commute to work or unfriendly neighbors.





When making location your top priority you may be limited in what you can build. Perhaps there are no empty lots available for new construction. You might have to consider renovating an existing home, or tearing it down and building an infill. What ever you choose, make sure the location is where you want to be.

2. Search your soul

Look deep to discover what truly makes you happy in your home. Ask yourself a few questions.

How do you want to live and feel in your new home?

What do you need to see (or hear from friends and family) to know that your dream home has been achieved?

How do you want your home to reflect who you are?

Describe an average day in the life of your ideal home, and then examine some of the most important days of the year. How will your home accommodate your family on a daily basis and also on special occasions?

Determining not only your needs but your wants and desires can be a long and difficult process for some people. It's important to set some parameters for your new design. You want to get it just right - if you don't, you may have regrets for as long as you live in your less-than-perfect home.

3. Budget

One of the first questions most people ask their designer is, "how much will this house cost to build?" Unfortunately, early in the design process, its often difficult to get an accurate number. Builders and contractors are the experts when it comes to pricing but they rely on detailed drawings to give an exact cost. With only preliminary sketches in hand, the best you can usually get is a ballpark figure.

So how can you narrow down a general price per square foot estimate?

Take a look at the complexity of the home. Does it have a complicated roofline? Are there lots of jogs and corners? Does it have a lot of exterior doors and windows? Simple homes cost less than more elaborate ones.

Another budget factor to consider is appliances. Some clients may spend \$25K on a single high end range, while other clients may spend less than that on their entire appliance package.

Don't forget about your outdoor spaces. Just because you want a smaller home doesn't mean it will be less expensive than a larger one. If you've got a

wrap-around porch, a large deck or patio, a screened room, long driveway and landscaping or water features, you could be spending as much as someone building a home that's twice as big but without all the exterior amenities.

One way to get a better preliminary estimate from your contractor is to be prepared with a detailed design brief. Preliminary sketches combined with a report that outlines what you are trying to achieve in your design can help reduce budget concerns later in the design process.

4. Find a Designer

Hiring a designer is one of the most important steps in the design process.



You'll need to find someone with the right personality that can collaborate with you and guide your design without forcing their ideas into it.
